LOCAL FOUNDATION AWARDS OVER \$3 MILLION
TO 31 LOS ANGELES NONPROFIT GROUPS

LOS ANGELES—The California Community Foundation (CCF) awarded \$3,730,000 Wednesday to 31 charitable organizations in the arts, human development, health, education and neighborhood revitalization targeting underserved communities in Los Angeles County. Grants will support general operating expenses, advocacy activities, building construction and capacity building efforts. The awards range from \$50,000 to \$235,000.

“We are proud to have geographic representation spanning Long Beach, the Westside and the Antelope Valley,” said Antonia Hernández, President and CEO at the foundation. “Our goal is to help to strengthen the communities in every corner of this sprawling County.”

Grant recipients include **Opera Noir, Inc.**, an arts organization that promotes African-American performers and composers of classical music; **Koreatown Youth and Community Center**, a multi-ethnic agency that provides comprehensive social services, including affordable housing, educational enrichment and mental health services to Latino and Korean American youth and families; **Hollywood Community Housing Corporation**, an organization that creates affordable housing; and **Families in Schools**, an organization that engages parents in their children’s education.
