**CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION AWARDS MORE THAN
\$1.7 MILLION TO 13 LOS ANGELES NONPROFIT GROUPS**

LOS ANGELES — The California Community Foundation (CCF) awarded \$1,728,000 to 13 charitable organizations in the arts, social services, health, education and affordable housing serving low-income communities in Los Angeles County. Grants will support general operating expenses, advocacy activities, building construction and capacity building efforts. The awards range from \$100,000 to \$300,000.

“These grants will help prepare children for school and will provide health care, affordable housing and the arts to those who can least afford it,” said Antonia Hernández, president and CEO at the foundation. “To have healthy and cohesive communities, our most vulnerable residents must have their basic needs met.”

Grant recipients include: **Latino Theater Company**, an arts organization that promotes understanding of contemporary Latino issues; **South Bay Family Healthcare Center**, which provides primary medical care to South Bay and Harbor Gateway residents; **LTSC Community Development Corporation**, an organization that creates affordable housing; and **Long Beach Day Nursery**, which provides early childhood education.
