



## 2021 Wildfire Recovery Fund Grantees

Grantee Name	Purpose
<a href="#">Direct Relief</a>	For their Power of Health Initiative, which seeks to equip selected health centers throughout California with solar-powered pharmaceutical refrigeration and/or back-up battery power units to allow for the management of temperature-sensitive medications independent of energy sources during power outages in times of wildfire.
<a href="#">Legacy Global Foundation</a> fbo <a href="#">Strong Water</a>	For use by Strong Water to undertake the required testing protocols set in place by the United States Forestry Service to test the performance, functionality, corrosivity and environmental impact of their wildfire-fighting technology, which is both a water additive and a helicopter delivery system using oversized, internal water tanks.
<a href="#">MySafe LA</a>	To support the resiliency efforts of MySafe LA to provide wildfire readiness education and training in Los Angeles communities, including surveys, printed materials in different languages, and coordination with L.A.-area fire agencies.
<a href="#">Nature Conservancy</a>	To support the efforts of the Indigenous Peoples Burning Network to coordinate collaborative training events with and among tribal communities, focused on cultural controlled burns; to provide travel scholarships to further the exchange of traditional knowledge about burning practices; to assist the Yurok tribe's fire department to develop a community-based fire management plan; to conduct collaborative cultural burning workshops and training exercises with the Chumash tribe to restore cultural burning traditions; and to strengthen statewide impact through networking with agencies and non-profits.
<a href="#">Paws 4 Life K9 Rescue</a>	In support of the P4L First Responder Program, which provides training and placement for dogs to serve as therapy companions to firefighters and other first responders in California who have suffered trauma and physical injuries during wildfire responses.
<a href="#">Plumas County Fire Safe Council</a>	To support their Senior Citizen/Disabled Defensible Space program, designed to "harden" homes in remote areas by clearing debris within a 100-foot radius, which is a free service to residents of Plumas County who are over 65 or disabled.
<a href="#">Project:Camp</a>	To support California families impacted by wildfires by launching one pop-up day camp to provide trauma-informed childcare and activities for large and small groups, allowing parents the space and time needed to conduct the business of wildfire recovery; and to organize and prepare two vulnerable communities in wildfire-prone areas of California to build resilience by creating plans to set up their own pop-up day camps.
<a href="#">Resources Legacy Fund</a> fbo Indigenous Stewardship Network	For use by the Indigenous Stewardship Network to partner with up to three tribes or Native-led non-profit organizations to implement programs in forest restoration and convene representatives from these groups to share knowledge and build capacity.

<p><a href="#">Sierra Foothill Conservancy</a> fbo Sierra Sequoia Burn Cooperative</p>	<p>For use by the Sierra Sequoia Burn Cooperative to coordinate all stages and aspects of multi-day, prescribed burn trainings in sparsely populated areas of rural, low-income residents; to provide direct funding to tribal communities for controlled burns, fuel reduction and other restoration treatments; and to plan, implement and sustain a program of burns and community-based forestry practices at broader scales within the region.</p>
<p><a href="#">Sierra Institute for Community and Environment</a></p>	<p>To support three programs in the Upper Feather River to stabilize and support rural, impoverished communities affected by the Dixie Fire: the Plumas Conservation Restoration Education in Watersheds (P-CREW) project, which provides restoration activities for rural and urban youth; the workforce development program, including local restoration crew training, deployment, and PPE; and the Mosaic Housing program, which aims to demonstrate construction techniques for fire-hardened, affordable homes, in an effort to encourage rebuilding by residents affected by the Dixie Fire.</p>
<p><a href="#">Team Rubicon USA</a></p>	<p>To support Team Rubicon's management, coordination, and delivery of fire mitigation services across highly vulnerable communities in California, which includes coordination with local fire safety councils and fire marshals to accurately assess community needs for services such as debris removal.</p>
