SIMPLE SOLUTIONS FOR CORPORATIONS

Private Foundation Alternative Fund:

A solution that helps you facilitate your corporation's charitable activities without the administrative hassles and management burden of a traditional private foundation. Referred to as a supporting organization of CCF, this entity has tax-exempt status as a public charity with a separate identity, its own mission and board of directors.

Scholarship Fund:

A popular option that allows donors to choose their level of involvement, from active involvement in the selection process or to setting the criteria and then letting CCF handle the rest.

This is the most efficient, cost-effective and flexible alternative to a private foundation for a corporation, with no minimum or maximum limits on grantmaking.

ACCEPTABLE ASSETS

Community foundations accept more than cash and publicly traded stock. Corporations may also contribute complex assets. Depending on your situation, you could take advantage of significant tax savings by contributing real estate, life insurance, interest in a closely held company and other illiquid assets.

CCF acknowledges all donations for tax purposes so you don't have to, and can easily connect your giving page to your company's website.
