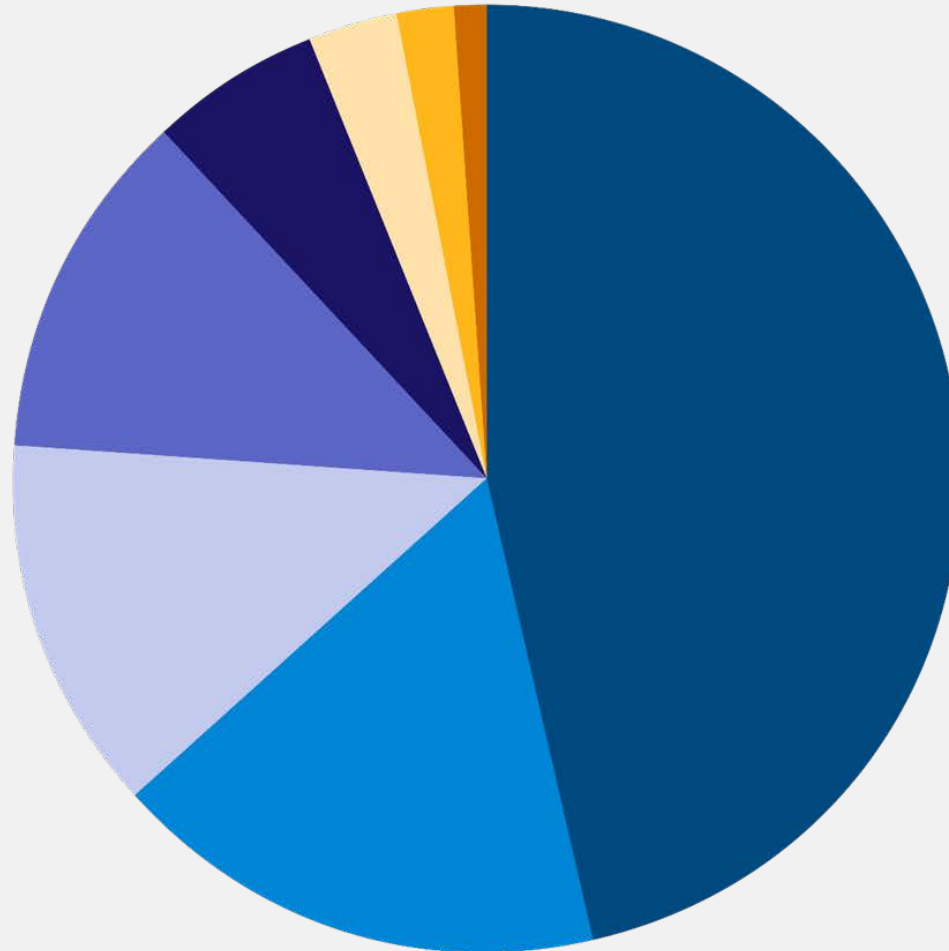

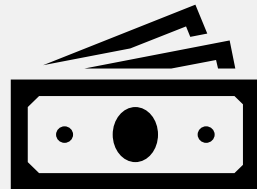

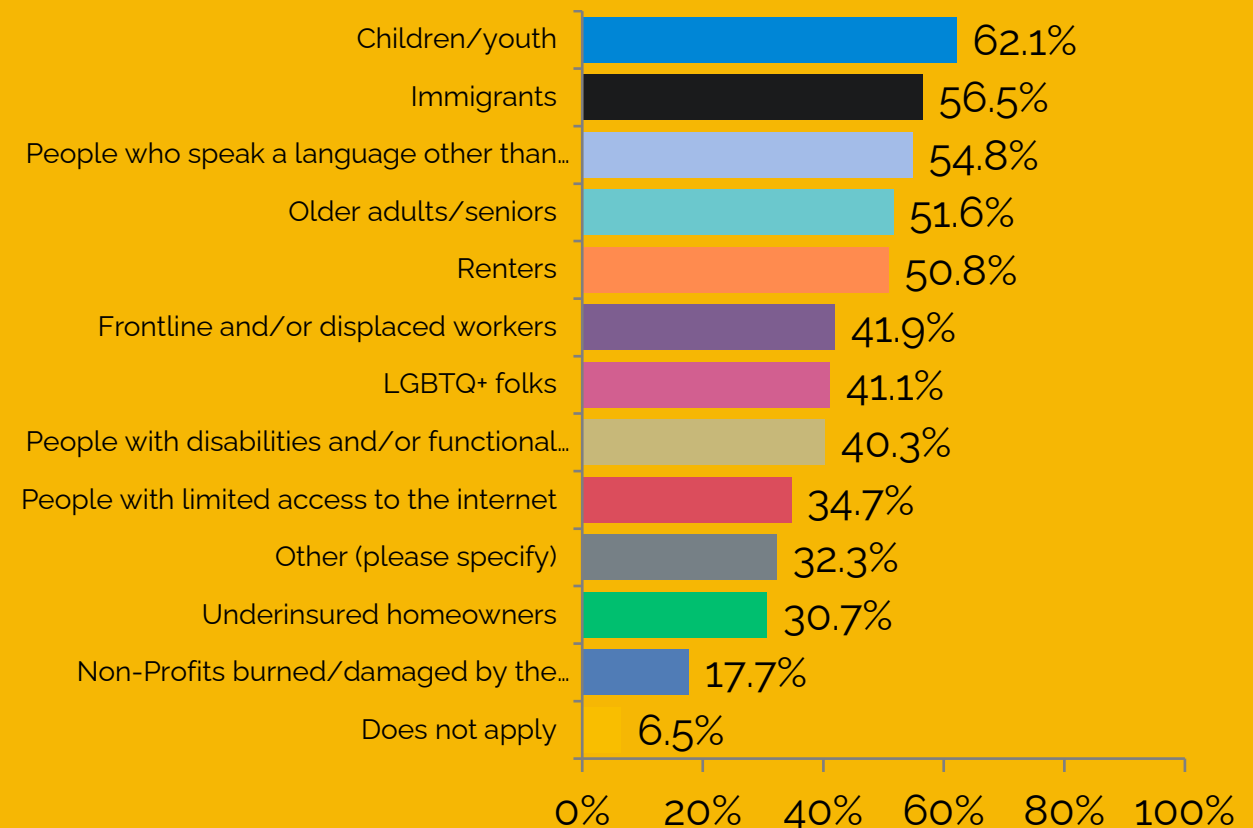
SERVICES PROVIDED



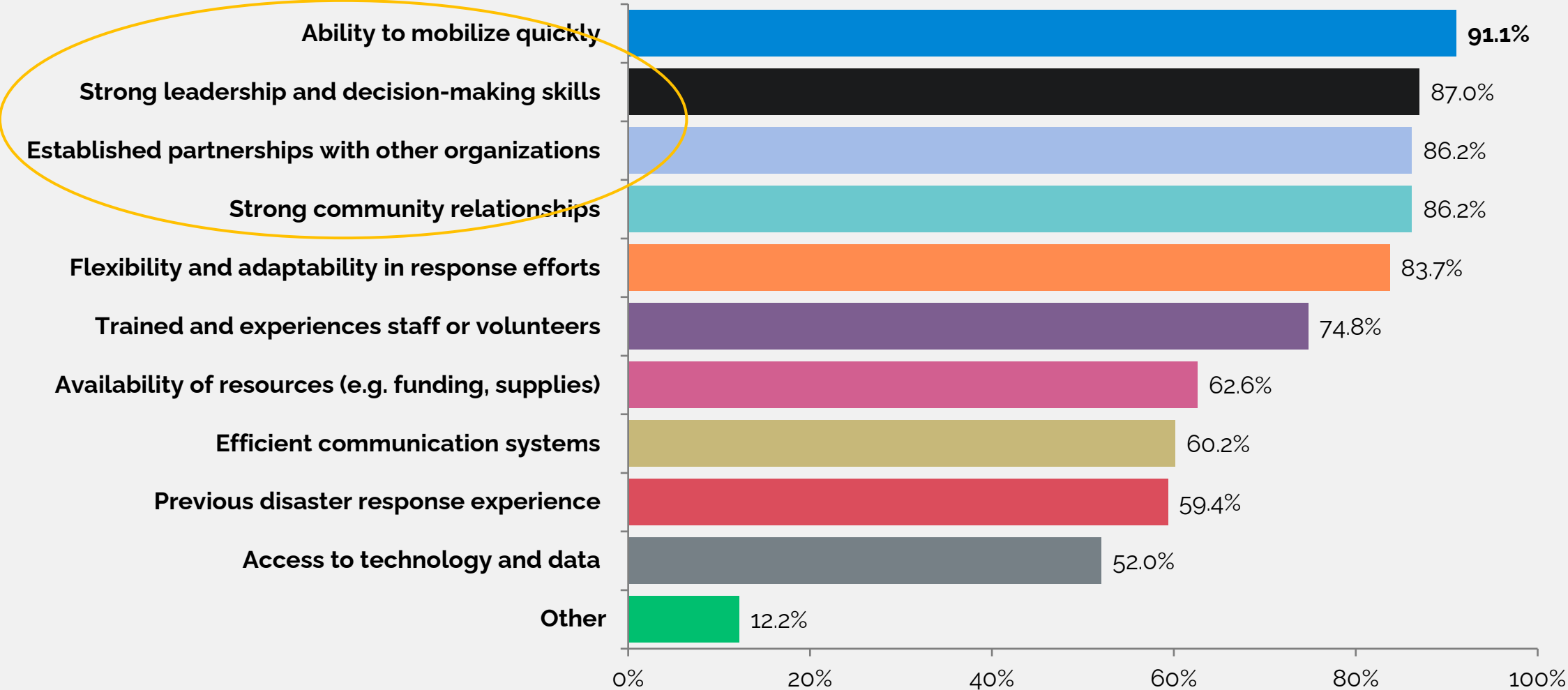
At least 35,000-40,000 individuals were served by (124) respondents to support:

Other (i.e. vet care, translation services, direct cash aid, etc.)

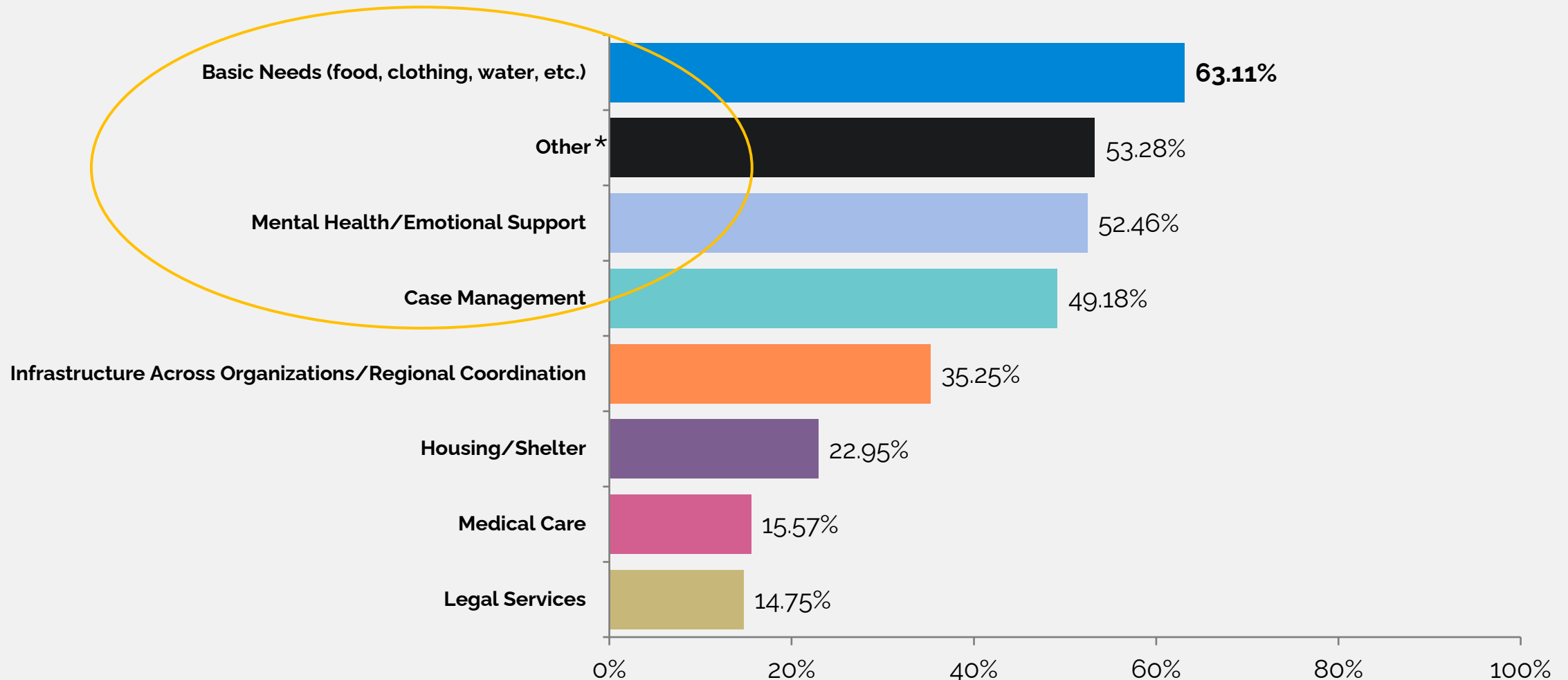
VULNERABLE POPULATIONS SERVED



NONPROFITS' STRENGTHS RELATED TO DISASTER RESPONSE



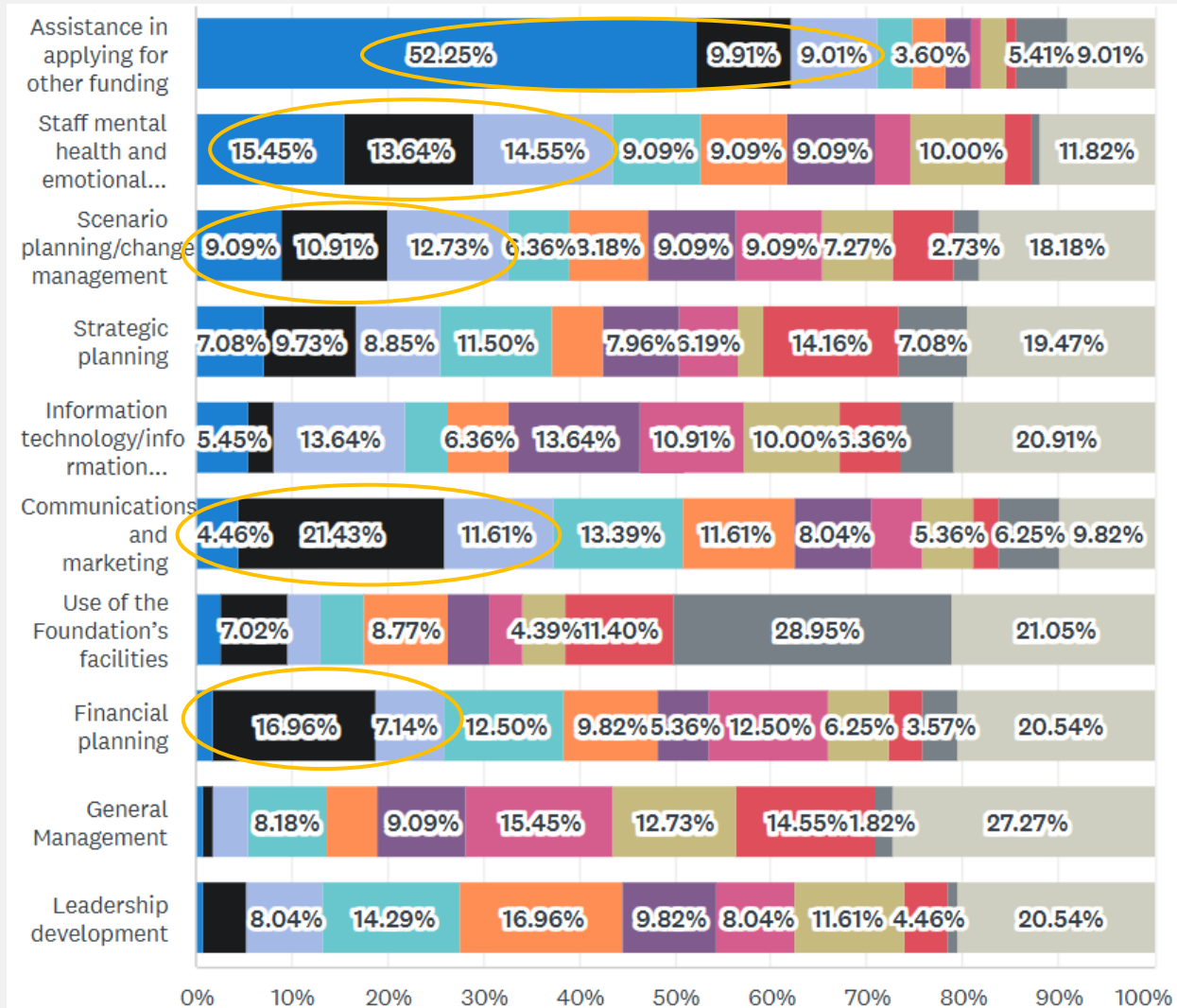
ASSISTANCE NONPROFITS CAN PROVIDE IN FUTURE DISASTERS



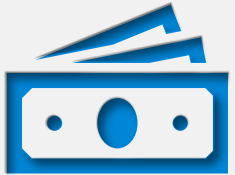
